
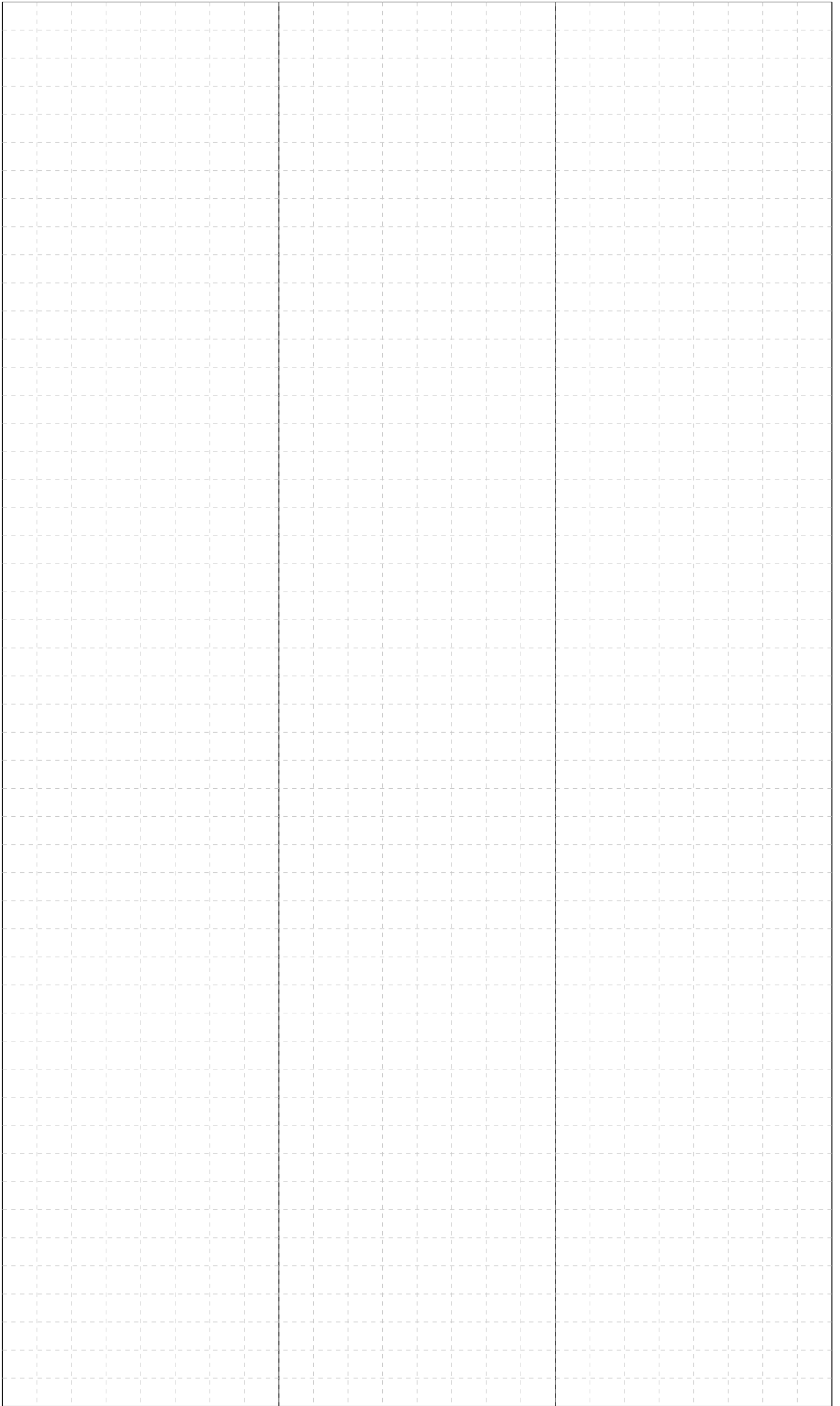



<p style="text-align: center;">INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER</p> <p>The following are instructions on how to vote your ballot. Please follow these instructions precisely, otherwise, your ballot may not be counted.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Verify that there are initials of an election official at the bottom of the ballot. Verify that there are no voting marks on the ballot. Use a black ink pen to mark the ballot. TO VOTE, you must darken the oval (●) completely. To vote for a WRITE-IN candidate, write in the name on the line provided AND darken the oval completely.  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Do NOT cross out or erase. If you make a mistake, contact the County Clerk's office at 308-928-2173 for instructions. Place voted ballot into the return envelope. Write your NE driver's license or state ID in the space provided on the envelope, or enclose a photocopy of an acceptable photo ID or Reasonable Impediment Certification (if applicable). Complete, SIGN and seal the envelope. Remember to moisten both seals to cover the voter ID and signature boxes. Any person physically unable to sign the envelope must make his/her "mark" and must have an individual witness. Failure to complete and sign the Return Identification Envelope will cause the ballot to be rejected. Do NOT place more than ONE (1) voted ballot into the return identification envelope. Return Ballot by: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Hand Delivery - deliver the ballot to the office of the County Clerk/Election Commissioner. Mail - return ballot by mail by placing proper return postage on the envelope. <p>VILLAGE OF OXFORD ADOPT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN</p> <p>Shall the Village of Oxford establish and continue an Economic Development Program as described herein by appropriating annually from local sources of revenue a minimum of \$40,000.00 for 15 years?</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p> <p>The terms, conditions, and goals of the Economic Development Program are as follows:</p> <p>a. Length of Time the Program Will Be In Existence: The program will be in existence for 20 years for the period of on or about January 1, 2025 to on or about January 1, 2045.</p> <p>b. Source and Years Within Which Funds From Local Sources of Revenue Are To Be Collected: Collection of the funds for the Economic Development Program shall be a portion of a 1½% sales and use tax to be collected for a 15 year period beginning on or about January 1, 2025 and continuing until on or about December 31, 2039.</p> <p>c. Total Amount To Be Collected For the Program From Local Sources of Revenue: The total amount to be collected from local sources of revenue for the length of the Economic Development Program will be a minimum of \$40,000.00 for each of the 15 years the sales tax is collected. The total amount to be collected for the Economic Development Program is \$600,000.00.</p> <p>d. Additional Funds To Be Sought From Other Non-Village Sources and Bonds: Additional funds from other non-village sources may be sought beyond those derived from local sources of revenue. The Village shall have the ability to issue bonds to provide funds to carry out the economic development program. Additional funds from other non-village sources, such as federal, state, and private grants, will be sought beyond those derived from local sources of revenue.</p> <p>e. Goals of the Economic Development Program: The goals of the Economic Development Program are to assist existing businesses and to create jobs through new or expanded business development.</p>	<p>Referendum Measure 435</p> <p>A vote to "RETAIN" will keep in effect Section 1 of Legislative Bill 1402 enacted in 2024 by the Nebraska Legislature.
